DAY HABILITATION SERVICES

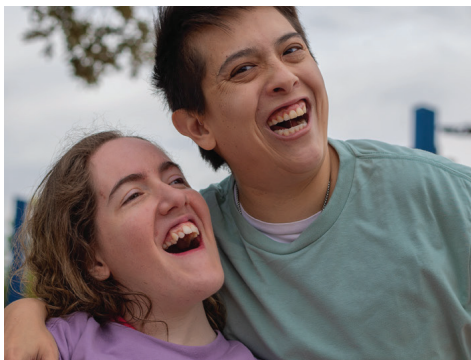
Our Day Habilitation Services focus on developmental skill training in self-care, self-preservation, self-direction, independent living skills, activities of daily living, hygiene, grooming, first aid, and overall wellness. In addition, we work on improving communication, socialization, and fine-and-gross motor skills, and providing enrichment through art, music, exercise, horticulture and in some instances volunteerism. Integrated occupational, physical, and speech therapy along with nursing and behavioral supports are available on-site. These services encourage person served growth and development. We work together with the persons we serve and their families to set measurable goals and objectives through individualized Day Habilitation Service Plans. These services are offered daily to adults, Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 2:30pm, for a maximum of a 6-hour day at a program location in the community.

COMMUNITY-BASED DAY SUPPORTS

Our Community-Based Day Supports provide persons served with the skills needed to grow, enhance, and maintain their abilities in personal, social, and community-based activities. The goals of Community-based Day Supports are to provide training in everyday living skills, community access, and the opportunity for people to enrich their lives. Community-Based Day Supports provide a clearly defined path for social and vocational advancement and independence. Included in the program are employment trainings and vocational options to develop and foster core skills necessary for social and vocational independence. We also offer a strong behavioral component directed by specially trained support staff. These services are offered daily to adults, Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 2:30pm, for a maximum of a 6-hour day or 30 hours per week at a program location and in the community.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Our Employment Services provide persons served with intellectual and developmental disabilities the support they need to develop important job skills and job experience needed to establish meaningful job opportunities. We provide this through community-based vocational training, support and employment. Vinfen offers persons served a variety of options to assist job seekers on their path to finding a career. We provide services that help our job seekers prepare for, obtain, and continue their highest possible level of employment through Group Supported Employment, Individual Supported Employment, and Arts Based Vocational Services. At Vinfen, we always develop jobs that pay at least minimum wage. We work together with persons served, their families, their residential providers, local businesses, the Massachusetts Department of Developmental Services, and community members to help persons served become more independent economically and socially. Supervisors, clinicians, job coaches, and the Job Developer are here to provide personalized training and support. This support is provided in the areas of career planning, searching for employment, social skills, communication skills, community access, mobility skills, and maintaining employment. These services are offered daily to adults, Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 2:30pm, however we offer flexibility in supports around employment placements.



CLUBHOUSE 2422

Our Clubhouse 2422 is a member driven program that provides a comprehensive set of person-centered services for persons served living with brain injuries. The clubhouse is a community-based program designed to assist persons served in increasing community integration and building interpersonal relationships and meaningful work. Persons served and staff work together in all areas of Center operations with a shared focus on developing or refining key life skills in areas such as: self-advocacy, community connections, education, financial counseling, housing opportunities, personal & life skills, and employment. The clubhouse is open Monday through Friday from 9:00am-5:00pm. Special events are held periodically on weekends and evenings.

FUNDING AND REFERRAL INFORMATION

Our Intellectual and Developmental Disability and Brain Injury Services are funded through a variety of sources that may include Massachusetts Department of Developmental Services, MassHealth, Third Party Payers (could include Tufts, Commonwealth Care Alliance, and others) Massachusetts Commission for the Blind, MassAbility, and Massachusetts Department of Education. Private Pay and other funding sources are also possible. Rates are set by the regulatory bodies of the service type. Members and their support team (guardians, families, residences, and Rep Payees) supported by Day Habilitation programs must maintain their MassHealth Common or Standard coverage in order for payment to continue in Day Hab if paid by MassHealth or a third-party administrator. Services availability is based on census and availability of a safe and therapeutic environment at each location at any given time. During the referral process it typically takes 30 days to gather all information prior to setting a start date.

For IDD, referrals are primarily made by the local Department of Developmental Services by the Service Coordinator or Transition Coordinator assigned for case management. For the BICC, referrals are primarily made by MassAbility but also support individuals on the ABI and MFP waiver in which case referrals would be made by DDS. Changes to service supports are led by member/guardian and Service Coordinator, Vinfen does not make referrals internally or to other providers. Options for persons served to direct their service design and delivery: members direct services in conjunction with their ISP/DHSP teams.

LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION INFORMATION

CBDS and Day Habilitation programs are CARF accredited; DDS funded services are licensed and certified via Survey & Certification; Day Habilitation services are reviewed at least every five years for MassHealth Revalidation and at any juncture with a MassHealth Integrity Audit; BICC services are reviewed by MassAbility and Revalidated.
